JACOB'S PILLOW PRESENTS THE WORLD PREMIERE OF EPHRAT ASHERIE DANCE'S ODEON

June 26, 2018 (Becket, MA) Jacob's Pillow presents the highly-anticipated world premiere of Ephrat Asherie Dance's *Odeon* in the Doris Duke Theatre, June 27-July 1. *Odeon* is a high-energy, hybrid work that layers breaking, hip-hop, house, and vogue to the buoyant score of 20th century Brazilian composer Ernesto Nazareth, played live.

"It has been so exciting to get to see the development of *Odeon* through many different iterations, including the inaugural residency in the new Pillow Lab last September. We are thrilled that this is the first project to emerge from the Lab as a world premiere for the Festival." says Jacob's Pillow Director Pamela Tatge.

The Boston Globe's "bona fide b-girl," Bessie Award-winning choreographer and dancer Ephrat "Bounce" Asherie collaborates with her brother Ehud Asherie, lauded as "a master of swing and stride" (The New Yorker). The duo reimagines Nazareth's signature compositions, noted for melding classical music with popular Afro-Brazilian rhythms. Featuring seven dancers and four musicians, Odeon brings together the extended legacies of street and club styles and remixes them to challenge choreographic contexts.

Praised as being "...versed in seemingly every style of street dance" (*The New York Times*), Asherie strives to use the expansive narrative qualities of street and club dance to tell stories, develop innovative imagery, and find new modes of expression through Ephrat Asherie Dance.

Coinciding with the world premiere, Asherie steps up to host the Pillow's second annual All Styles Dance Battle on July 1. This one-night-only event features Festival artists, dancers of The School at Jacob's Pillow, regional artists, surprise judges, and DJ DP One aka "The Blessing".

Odeon was developed in part during two residencies at Jacob's Pillow and through a co-presentation with MASS MoCA. Asherie is the inaugural recipient of the Jacob's Pillow Fellowship at the Tilles Center for Performing Arts at LIU Post, where she further developed this work. The touring of *Odeon* is supported by a National Dance Project award from the New England Foundation for the Arts.

ABOUT EPHRAT "BOUNCE" ASHERIE

Ephrat "Bounce" Asherie is a New York City-based B-girl, dancer, and choreographer and a 2016 Bessie Award-winner for Innovative Achievement in Dance. Asherie has received numerous awards to support her work including a Mondo Cane! commission from Dixon Place, a creative development residency at

the Pillow Lab from Jacob's Pillow, Workspace and Extended Life Residencies from the Lower Manhattan Cultural Council, a Travel and Study Grant from the Jerome Foundation, and two residencies through the CUNY Dance Initiative. Most recently, Asherie received a National Dance Project award to support the development and touring of her newest work, *Odeon*. Asherie is a regular guest artist with Dorrance Dance and has worked and collaborated with Doug Elkins, Rennie Harris, Bill Irwin, David Parsons, Gus Solomons Jr., and Buddha Stretch, among others. Asherie earned her B.A. from Barnard College, Columbia University in Italian and her M.F.A. from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, where she researched the vernacular jazz dance roots of contemporary street and club dances.

ABOUT EHUD ASHERIE

Ehud Asherie, "a master of swing and stride" (*The New Yorker*), is a jazz pianist who integrates the venerable New York piano tradition into his inventive style. He has toured clubs and festivals around the world, including South America, Europe, and Asia. Asherie's playing can be heard on countless recordings, including the 2010 Grammy Award winning soundtrack of HBO's *Boardwalk Empire*. He recently released his twelfth album entitled *Shuffle Along* (Blue Heron Records), a solo piano performance of Eubie Blake songs from the musical *Shuffle Along*.

PILLOW CONNECTIONS

Ephrat Asherie Dance made its Pillow debut as part of *Unreal Hip-Hop* in 2014. Asherie also performed with Dorrance Dance as the only non-tap dancer in 2014 and 2016 and will perform with the company in their 2018 Festival engagement, July 18-22.

Pilobolus at Jacob's Pillow

June 27-July 1, Wednesday-Saturday at 8pm; Thursday, Saturday, Sunday at 2pm Ted Shawn Theatre

For 45 years, this "mind-blowing troupe of wildly creative and physically daring dancers" (*NY Newsday*) has tested the limits of human physicality, exploring the beauty and power of connected bodies. Pilobolus collaborates with innovative artists, thinkers, and creators to reach beyond performance, bringing stories to diverse communities, brands, and organizations. Pilobolus has created over 120 pieces, performing for 300,000+ people each year. The company's honors include a TED Fellowship, a GRAMMY nomination, a Primetime Emmy Award, and several Cannes Lion Awards.

The company returns to the Ted Shawn Theatre with *Come To Your Senses*, a program of works about accessing all five senses, as well as new and old repertory including a re-working of the site-specific commission *Branches*, which premiered in 2017 on the Inside/Out stage to celebrate the power of the Pillow's natural setting. *Tickets start at \$45*.

Inside/Out Performance Series: Translucent Borders Wednesday, June 27 at 6:15pm FREE; LIVE MUSIC

Spearheaded by a three-year exploration of intercultural dialogue, practice, and exchange led by New York University (NYU) Tisch Arts Professor, Dr. Andy Teirstein, that focuses on the role of dance and music at geographic, cultural, and economic borders, the international collaborators of Translucent Borders present an inter-cultural work-in-progress. The performance will include short introductions to help contextualize the work.

This special engagement follows a three-day, on-site residency at Jacob's Pillow that brings together over 20 collaborators from Cuba, Israel, Ghana, Trinidad and Tobago, the United States, and Italy for the first time, with some artists making their U.S. debuts.

Gotta Dance. Too!

This select group of original movie posters follows up on the hugely popular 2014 *Gotta Dance* exhibit with a different set of rarities from the collection of award-winning design director Mike Kaplan. More than 50 vintage posters feature classic films and stars like Fred Astaire, Josephine Baker, Gene Kelly, and other screen legends, excitingly illustrated in vibrant color.

Commemorating the 80th anniversary of *Dance of the Ages*, a culminating achievement by Ted Shawn and His Men Dancers, this exhibit also highlights a full reconstruction of the work to be performed by

Adam H. Weinert at Jacob's Pillow, September 21-23. The exhibit features images, memorabilia, and costumes from the original 1938 production, many on view for the first time.

Paramodernities/Revelations Doris Duke Theatre Lobby, June 20-August 26 Open 60 minutes prior to every performance

Netta Yerushalmy has created a new performance work entitled *Paramodernities* with its premiere on deconstructing classic dances by pioneering choreographers. Historic Pillow images from one of these, Alvin Ailey's iconic *Revelations*, are displayed here and juxtaposed with photos and text from Yerushalmy's 2018 re-examination, premiering August 8-12.

Jacob's Pillow Archives/Norton Owen Reading Room Blake's Barn, June 20-August 26 Open daily, Wed-Sat noon to final curtain (approx. 10pm) and Sun-Tue noon to 5pm FREE

This spacious, informal library and reading room allows impromptu visitors to view videos, browse through books, access the Pillow's computer catalog, or peruse permanent collections of Pillow programs and photographs from the Pillow's Archives. The Norton Owen Reading Room also features recent donations and more archival treasures from the Stephan Driscoll Collection. Jacob's Pillow Dance Interactive, available on a popular touch-screen kiosk in the Reading Room, provides instant access to rare film clips ranging from the present day back to the 1930s.

Collaborative Exhibition at The Williams College Museum of Art (WCMA) Dance We Must: Treasures from Jacob's Pillow, 1906-1940 June 29-November 11 FREE

The Williams College Museum of Art has created an eye-popping new exhibit with costumes, set pieces, and other historic artifacts from the collections at Jacob's Pillow. On view through November 20, this exhibit offers a rare chance to see items from the dawn of American modern dance, tracing the evolution of this contemporary art form. *More information at wcma.williams.edu*

ABOUT JACOB'S PILLOW: Jacob's Pillow is a National Historic Landmark, recipient of the National Medal of Arts, and home to America's longest-running international dance festival. While celebrating its 85th Festival in 2017, the Pillow announced its transition to becoming a year-round center for dance through a five-year strategic plan titled Vision '22. Each Festival includes more than 50 national and international dance companies and over 350 free and ticketed performances, talks, tours, classes, exhibits, events, and community programs. The School at Jacob's Pillow, one of the most prestigious professional dance training centers in the U.S., encompasses the diverse disciplines of Ballet, Contemporary, Musical Theatre Dance, Choreography, and an annual rotating program (Gaga in 2018). The Pillow also provides professional advancement opportunities across disciplines of arts administration, design, video, and production through seasonal internships and a year-round Administrative Fellows program. With growing community engagement programs, the Pillow serves as a partner and active citizen in its local community. The Pillow's extensive Archives, open year-round to the public and online at danceinteractive iacobspillow.org, chronicle more than a century of dance in photographs, programs, books, costumes, audiotapes, and videos. Notable artists who have created or premiered dances at the Pillow include choreographers Antony Tudor, Agnes de Mille, Alvin Ailey, Donald McKayle, Kevin McKenzie, Twyla Tharp, Ralph Lemon, Susan Marshall, Trisha Brown, Ronald K. Brown, Wally Cardona, Andrea Miller, and Trey McIntyre; performed by artists such as Mikhail Baryshnikov, Carmen de Lavallade, Mark Morris, Dame Margot Fonteyn, Edward Villella, Rasta Thomas, and hundreds of others. On March 2. 2011. President Barack Obama honored Jacob's Pillow with a National Medal of Arts, the highest arts award given by the United States Government, making the Pillow the first dance presenting organization to receive this prestigious award.
